Short Term Car Insurance in the UK

Short term car insurance can be a great way of saving money if you don't use the vehicle that often. This kind of cover is also good for allowing someone else to drive your vehicle for a short period of time.

Car insurance is expensive for any driver, let alone those who are under 25 years old or have been driving for less than three years. Insurance cover is generally valid for a year and most people replace their contracts every year. This means that once you have agreed to a car insurance provider, you are probably bound to them for the next year.

Therefore, when you have chosen a vehicle cover company you are contracted to their services for 365 days. [Short term car insurance in the UK](#) means that with most companies you can insure a vehicle for anything between one and 28 days although some might provide you with insurance for up to 6 months. This kind of policy is useful if you have just bought a new vehicle or need to allow someone else to drive your car for a while.

One of the major benefits of short term car insurance is that it is flexible. The duration of the cover is up to you. Temporary vehicle cover in England is valid as soon as you pay for the insurance so it is quick to use if you need it immediately. The method of making an insurance claim is similar to normal insurance claims – if something happens you need to notify your vehicle cover company as soon as possible.

Although it is possible to get short term car insurance in the UK for your car as a replacement for annual insurance, it is important to remember to declare your car off the road during the time you are not using the insurance. It is illegal not to have vehicle cover in England and you might get into trouble even though you are not getting behind the wheel uninsured.

Short term car insurance in the UK has been a help to many people.
